

Definitions and explanations

REGISTRATION

Prerequisite – course required to be taken prior registration and then graded not less than passing grade. In some cases it can be replaced with special requirements (if listed) such as department placement test, high score in related CPS course, etc.

Corequisite – course which should be taken concurrently (or prior) registration. If the corequisite was taken before then it has to be graded not less than corequisite passing grade.

Antirequisite – equivalent or advanced course taken before that forbids registration for the course.

Passing grade – grade established for each type of requisite within one School.

First priority – category of students who can register first.

Second priority – category of students who register after first priority category.

Blank(not defined) priority – course is open for all students.

Pending registration means that your grades will be compared against your schedule. If you receive insufficient grade or fail the course that was a required pre/co-requisite that course will be dropped automatically. Notification will be sent prior to dropping from the course, so you can reregister for appropriate courses.

FORMS

Course overload form is used if number of enrolled credits is more than allowed maximum (36 ECTS credits).

Extra place form is used if instructor gives you permission for extra place in overloaded class.

Requisite override form is used for exceptional cases when instructor gives a permission to register for course without satisfying required requisite.

Retake permission form should be submitted to retake the course which was not failed but graded less than passing grade. Each student may retake no more than two courses during his or her undergraduate studies at NU, and no course may be retaken more than once.

Priority override form is used for exceptional cases when student is given permission to register for the course not keeping established priority.

Change of Kazakh level form is used for changing level of Kazakh language.
